The next monthly meeting will be Monday, October 17 at 7:00 at Cam Clark Ford. Everyone is welcome. These are enjoyable meetings and a great way for parents to become better informed about the Royals!

A few points to remember

We've had another really great start to the band year! As information to First Year members and as a reminder to everyone:

- Attend all rehearsals unless it's absolutely impossible. A team effort requires the whole team.
- In the case of an unavoidable conflict with another activity, it's better to come late than not at all.
- You must contact both the Director (Mr. Mann) by phone (403-346-3911), text (403-391-0514) or email (directorofbands@reddeerroyals.com), as well as your Section Leader if you are unable to attend a rehearsal or if you'll be unavoidably late.
- "If you're on time, you're late!" means you should arrive at rehearsal no later than 6:15 so you can have a seat and be ready to rehearse on time. By 6:30 you should have done your own warm-up and be ready to go. This goes for Winds, Guard and Drumline.
- Be patient, focused, & quiet even when you have to wait and listen to another section work on a part.
- Always have your equipment, music, black **Royals** folder and a pencil at every rehearsal. A pencil is a must! Make sure you have your own copy of each of our pieces; if you're missing one just notify your Section Leader or Assistant Section Leader.
- After rehearsal, everyone looks after putting their own chair and music stand on the racks. For music stands, we use a rotation system in which a particular section sets them up and puts the trolleys away in the trailer at the end of the night. When it's your section's turn, please be at rehearsal by 6:00 or 6:10 and be prepared to stay an extra five or ten minutes at the end of rehearsal. Percussion and Colour Guard are not in the rotation because they have their own equipment to look after.
- When it comes to chores, please help out and share the load; it's the **Royals** way!

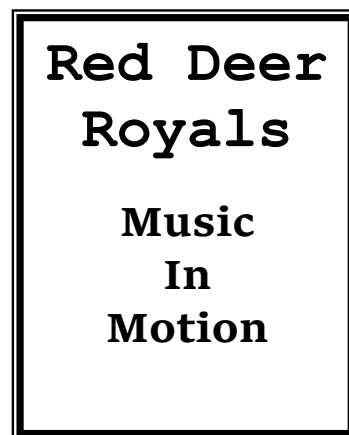
