Uniform Update (Review Uniform Policy)

PARADE SEASON BEGINS!

These are a few things that you need to have organized the NIGHT BEFORE the parade. Pack them up and have them ready at the door so there is less chance that you will forget them

GENERAL

- Travel Jacket on your body. This is your ticket to get on the bus and have lunch
- Black socks (no logos) should come to mid-calf, NO ANKLE SOCKS. It never hurts to have an extra pair in your garment bag.

BAND PARADE UNIFORMS

- Parade Uniform only in garment bag (leave concert uniform at home)
- Black round neck short sleeve T-shirt on your body
- Boxers or Spandex shorts on your body
- Super Drillmasters cleaned/polished
- Shako brim and Maple Leaf emblem polished/finger print free.
- Gloves to be kept in your shako as you will wear them on cold, wet days.

COLOUR GUARD PARADE UNIFORMS

- Tunic/Pants/Parade Jacket
- Kulerswift black parade shoes cleaned

PERSONAL GROOMING

- A container with elastics/bobby pins/hair nets, etc. Whatever you need to ensure your hair is performance ready.
- Remove any fingernail polish the night before
- Musicians and Colour Guard No jewelry of any type will be worn. This includes such items as earrings and studs of any type or description, rings, necklaces, watches, pins, bracelets, and all other items deemed jewelry during inspection. If a piercing needs to be worn, it must be a clear or skin toned plug. In addition, tattoos not covered by the uniform must be covered with an acceptable opacity concealer for all performances. Unnatural hair coloring or style will be unacceptable where it is deemed to detract from the uniformity of the Band.
- Male members need to be clean-shaven
- Female Band members light make-up ONLY (foundation/mascara)

It is not the Red Deer Community Band Society's job to provide you with bandages, hairnets, elastics, bobby pins, and nail polish remover.

If it rains on parade day, and your uniform gets wet (including the shako), please take them out of the bags when you get home and allow them to air dry. If you have mud on your pants, then let them dry and brush them off or have them cleaned in time for the next performance.

Dry-cleaning Schedule (Summer Rush Cleaning)

Classic cleaners has arranged to have our uniforms rush cleaned before and after the Stampede week. Please make sure you follow the drop off dates and times as they are bringing in extra staff to accommodate our performance schedule. As always, this service is free please give them a big thank you when you stop in!

- 1. July 2 from 4-6 or night drop off. (They need to have all items before 5am on the 3rd.) Must be well labelled and in a bag. Bin code for drop off is 423. Pickup will be July 3 or 4 in time for Sounds of Summer.
- 2. July 12 drop off before 10am or late on July 11 when we return from Calgary. Bin code 423. These will be ready for pick up in the 13th in time for our Rimbey Parade.
- 3. You are encouraged to get your uniform cleaned anytime it is dirty or smelly! Be mindful of your performance dates so that you have your uniform back in time.
- 4. Members can then make arrangements to get them in again after our last performance.

* For most bussed events, the buses depart from and return to the <u>Home of the Red Deer Royals/Kinsmen Fieldhouse at St.</u>

Joseph's High School. *

** Your ticket onto the bus and to lunch for all events is your clean travel jacket. **

*** Wearing your jacket to all events is a MUST! (You won't get on the bus or get lunch without it!!) ***

**** There will be a uniform inspection before each event. Make sure you're good to go! ****

July 5 - 11 CALGARY STAMPEDE WEEK

The fee per member this year will be \$250. This will cover part of our transportation, accommodation and meals. The fee was due by Wed June 14.

We'll be staying at Crescent Heights High School, 1019 1st Street NW, Calgary. Emergency phone number is 403-391-0514 (Mr. Mann's cell phone). Please use these phone numbers for emergencies only.

The following is based on the info I have as of June 13.

Thurs July 5	We are planning to leave from our camp at SJHS around 3:00 Evening sectionals at the school.
Fri July 6	Parade in the morning 350,000 will be lining the streets of downtown Calgary! Set your PVR! Rehearsal at Crescent Heights in the afternoon.
Sat July 7	8:00 AM – Calgary Ismaili Breakfast Full day rehearsal at Crescent Heights.
Sun July 8	Full day rehearsal at Crescent Heights. 3:30 PM – Prelims for Showbands Live 8:00 PM – Grandstand Show and Firework on Stampede Park
Mon July 9	Full day rehearsal at Crescent Heights and Clinic Possible Band Council activity at the school in the evening.
Tue July 10	Full day rehearsal at Crescent Heights. 6:00 PM – Showbands Live – finals, McMahan Stadium
Wed July 11	10:00 AM – Caravan Breakfast @ Dalhousie Station 11:00 AM – Pack and load busses, depart after lunch for Stampede Park 1:00 PM – 3:15 PM – Free time on Park 4:30 PM – Performance on the Saddledome Steps at Stampede Park? 5:00 until 8:00 Free time in groups of 3 or more on Stampede Park. Dinner on your own on the Park. We'll give you \$10 cash for your dinner. We will have optional check-ins with parent chaperones throughout the day. 10:00 PM – Arrive back in Red Deer

The above schedule will continue to be refined and firmed up. We'll provide a more precise schedule during our show camps at the beginning of July at the latest.

Suggested things to take to Stampede:

- 7 or 8 black t-shirts (We have 8 performances.)
- 8 pairs of black socks
- towel & face cloth
- rubber sandals for shower. A daily shower is mandatory! Some people are more comfortable wearing a bathing suit in the showers.
- toiletries (shampoo, soap, toothpaste, toothbrush, comb, brush, things for hair, etc.) Deodorant is mandatory!
- running shoes
- clothing appropriate for the weather for 5 6 days.
- air mattress or foamy, sleeping bag, pillow, sheet
- sunscreen, sunglasses, hat, water bottle
- cleaning supplies for Drill Masters, extra black laces
- · marching uniform, Drill Masters. Don't forget your gloves!
- instrument/equipment and music, charts, instrument/equipment supplies
- money for snacks and free day on the Stampede grounds. Consider pre-buying a wristband or tickets pack for the rides before you leave home.
- frisbee, hackey, etc.
- no blasters; personal players only (ex. ipod)
