These camps are for the Colour Guard members to begin work on the 2018/2019 Winterguard Show.

Attendance to all portions of the camp is mandatory. Due to the visual and physical nature of drill and choreography, missing a member for any portion of rehearsal can drastically impact the ability of staff and members to rehearse effectively. Please plan and schedule accordingly; it's in your best interest to learn the new material when we're teaching it!

Music Memorization:

Here's your memorization schedule for October and November

- "Warm-up/Tune-up Chorale", "O Canada", and Royals Fanfare memorized by October 24.
- "Superstition" and "Shut Up and Dance" first half by November 1 and to the end by November 15.
- "Hey Baby" first half by November 1 and to the end by November 15.
- You should have the following scales committed to memory: Concert Bb, Eb, F and Ab.

We'll work on memorization at rehearsals, but it's also your responsibility to work on it in your home practice.

It often really helps memorize a piece by listening to a recording of it.
